The 2016 NSCH also asks about children who are bullied. The 2011/12 NSCH asked if a child "bullies or is cruel or mean to others," and the 2009/10 NS-CSHCN asked if a child experiences difficulty with "behavior problems such as acting-out, fighting, bullying, or arguing." The 2016 NSCH asks if a child "bullies others, picks on them, or excludes them" and if a child "is bullied, picked on, or excluded by other children."
